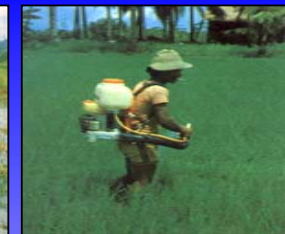

FOREWORD

This report has been generated from the results of the Integrated Farm Household Survey (IFHS) which collected important benchmark characteristics of farms and farming population in the country. The IFHS, with reference period July 2002 to June 2003, covered 5,920 farm households nationwide except in Batanes and Lanao del Sur. It utilized a two-stage stratified sampling design with provinces as the domain and the barangays and farm households as the primary and secondary sampling units, respectively. The sample barangays were drawn from the 1999 Barangay Screening Survey of the Bureau of Agricultural Statistics and were set at 6 for small provinces and 9 for large agricultural provinces. For each sample barangay, 10 sample farm households (i.e. those households with at least one member engaged in agricultural activities) were randomly selected using the 2000 Census of Population and Housing of the National Statistics Office.

This report puts together the statistical data that can characterize the **socio-economic conditions of farm households in Ilocos Region**. To enhance appreciation and understanding of the regional condition, the national level data are included in the presentation of statistical tables. Other details of data regarding the region are contained in the IFHS main report entitled "Socio-Economic Characteristics of Farm Households in the Philippines".

HIGHLIGHTS

Household Characteristics

- The average size of households in Ilocos Region comprised 4.85 members.
- Majority or 87.26 percent of the households were headed by males. Average age of the household heads was 49 years old.
- Of all household heads, 97.77 percent had formal education. About 23.25 percent were elementary graduates, 22.61 percent finished high school while only 5.41 percent were college degree holders.
- Farming was the main occupation of 87.72 percent of household heads. Palay farmers represented 87.02 percent of the household heads.

Farm Characteristics

- Majority or 95.86 percent of farm households were engaged in crop farming. Those in livestock and poultry raising were 74.84 percent.
- Average number of farm parcels operated by farm households was 2.27. Parcels held under CLT/CLOA comprised the biggest average size of 1.49 hectares.
- Temporary crops occupied 68.07 percent of the farm parcels.
- Irrigated farm parcels shared 60.87 percent in total farm area with 76.80 percent had their own irrigation system.
- The value of average inventory on farm investments was highest in farm machineries and transport equipment at P11,922. Inventory on farm building and structures had an average value of P1,649; farm tools, equipment and other supplies, P1,006; and fishing gears, P100.

Farm Enterprise

- Palay was grown by all households. Some 26.91 percent of farm households planted corn while 25.25 percent grew mango.
- Backyard raising of livestock and poultry was more common among households.
- More than half of households or 53.85 percent were engaged in inland fishing while those in marine fishing were 46.15 percent. Those involved in gathering of shells, aquarium fish, etc were 10.26 percent.
- About 11.11 percent of the households were engaged in fishpond operation.

Income and Expenditure Patterns

- Annual income of farm households in Ilocos Region averaged P118,637. About 43.45 percent of the household income was derived from farming, 30.39 percent from non-farm activities, 22.49 percent from other sources like pensions, etc. and the remainder was from off-farm activities.
- The bulk or 78.03 percent of the farm income were sourced from crop farming while 17.09 percent came from capture fishing and aquaculture.
- Of the total income from crop farming, palay production contributed 55.90 percent. Other permanent crops shared 33.64 percent.
- By farm enterprise, crop farming generated the highest net returns at P27,069. This amounted to P8,805 in capture fishing and aquaculture and only P1,225 in livestock and poultry raising.
- The biggest portion of household expenditures at 49.20 percent was spent for food. Farm expenditures accounted 22.60 percent of household expenses.
- Meat and meat preparations shared 27.53 percent in the total food expenditures of households while cereals accounted for 21.01 percent.
- Recurring expenses comprised 7.46 percent of the total household expenditures while non-recurring expenses accounted 20.74 percent.

Credit Information

- About 13.69 percent of farm households availed of loans worth less than P100,000. Biggest portion of borrowers at 64.58 percent availed loans for agricultural production.

Access to Government Program

- Awareness on government programs in crop farming was cited by 81.53 percent of farm households, by 11.15 percent in livestock and poultry raising and by 3.82 percent in capture fishing and aquaculture.
- Beneficiaries of government programs on crop farming were 3.98 percent of farm households; on livestock and poultry raising, 6.81 percent; and on capture fishing and aquaculture, 10.26 percent.
