NOTES ON SECTION 9

HOUSEHOLD EXPENDITURE

Non-Food expenditures include expenditures on Clothing, Footwear, Personal Care, Entertainment and Recreation, Transportation, Housing Supplies, Housing, Furniture, Household Appliances, Other Consumer Durables, Education and Health.

Lottery Tickets are excluded from Household Expenditure because they enhance well-being only when the household wins the lottery. In that case the amount won is likely to reflect as increased expenditure on other Goods.

The following items are not regarded as expenses, as they do not increase economic well-being – Income Taxes, Security Funds, Insurance and Gift Transfers.

The following items are excluded because expenditures on them are likely to be reflected in the current value of the relevant consumer durable, expenditures on which are treated separately:

- ✚ Materials purchased to build a new house;
- ✚ Expenses for building new house other than materials to build a new house;
- ✚ Home Repairs;
- ✚ Painting, etc;
- ✚ Bike Tires;
- ✚ Tube and bike spare parts;
- ✚ Motor bike tire, tube and spare parts;
- ✚ Repair and other expenses for vehicles, other than petrol and oil.

A measure of the Value of Services provided by Consumer Durables (their “Use Value” in the 12 months preceding the interview) involves the following steps:

1. Derivation of depreciation rates for each type of Consumer Durable. $VB = VT (1 - d)^t$, where VB=Real Value of a Good at the time of purchase; VT is the value at time of interview; t = number of years since purchase; and d=rate of Depreciation.
2. $d = 1 - [VB / VT]^{1/t}$
3. Use Value = $VI [1 + d] \times [d + 0.05]$, where 0.05 is an estimate of the real interest rate

NOTES ON SECTION 11B

INCOME TRANSFERS

Expenditure for Assistance in Cash and in Kind that the Household members send to their children, brothers, sisters, parents or relatives or others who are not household members. **These expenditures are regarded as assistance, rather than gifts or presents.** The sender must be a member of the household and the receiver, a non-household member.

Examples:

A household member who sends money to his brother for school, and his brother is living with his parents in another household in the same locality or in another locality. This Expenditure is regarded as **expenditure for assistance**.

A household residing in a locality which has the custom that when any household builds an house, has a funeral, wedding, etc then other households are responsible for assisting that household. This sum can be contributed in Cash or in Kind. Such contribution is **expenditure for assistance**.

NOTES ON SECTION 12

CREDIT, ASSETS AND SAVINGS

Borrowing is the amount of money or kind that **Household Members** borrow from **Other Non-Household Members or Banks**, and is paid back on agreed conditions and terms.

Lending is the amount of money or kind that **Household Members** lent to **Other Non-Household Members** and paid on agreed conditions and Terms.
